



Dear Order of the Arrow Candidate:

The Order of the Arrow (OA) is Scouting's National Honor Society chartered by the Boy Scouts of America. Founded in 1915, the OA recognizes campers who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives, promotes camping, and crystallizes the habit of cheerful service as a life purpose. It is an organization composed of Scouts (called arrowman) from different Troops, Ships and Crews, and is led by those Scouts under the guidance of selected adult advisers.

As a result of an OA election conducted at your unit within the past year, you were chosen as a candidate for induction into the Order of the Arrow. In order to become a new member, you must complete the Induction Weekend within one year from the date of your election. The Induction lasts from Friday night until Sunday morning, and you MUST complete the entire Induction Weekend to become a member. If you fail to complete your Induction within one and a half years (1.5 years) from your election, you must be re-elected by your unit.

Yerba Buena Lodge is pleased to invite you to our upcoming Order of the Arrow Induction Weekend.

- The weekend will be held at Camp Royaneh (near Cazadero) beginning on Friday evening (10/04), through Sunday (10/06). <u>Candidates need to arrive at camp between 8:00 PM and 9:00 PM Friday evening</u>.
- If you are over 18, you must meet additional requirements, see bottom of next page.

Please note that dinner is not provided Friday night, so you should have dinner before arriving at camp. Attached is a list of what to bring. Your parent/guardian should arrive by 10:30 AM so please plan on leaving camp around 11:00 am on Sunday morning.

Enclosed with this letter you should find all the information needed. We cannot reiterate the importance of you bringing a copy of the BSA Medical Forms (A and B) and having your parent/guardian sign it. Failure to have the medical form filled out and signed means you will be unable to participate in the scheduled Induction.

The cost for the Induction Weekend is \$85.00. The fee, combined with a subsidy from our Lodge, will cover:

- Cost of the weekend including food
- OA membership dues for the remainder of the current year
- OA sash
- OA handbook
- 1 Lodge pocket flap

Things to Bring to the Induction Weekend

- 1. BSA Medical form (Parts A&B), paper copy
- 2. Class A uniform and Class B Shirt
- 3. Warm sleeping bag and pad
- 4. Ground cloth AND a small/personal tent
- 5. Warm jacket or sweater
- 6. Sturdy pair of work shoes or boots (closed toe only)
- 7. Set of work clothes including long pants (Recommend a long sleeve shirt as well)
- 8. Work gloves
- 9. Personal Camp Chair
- 10. Hat (Recommended)
- 11. Sun protection (Sunglasses and sunscreen)
- 12. Water bottle (Reusable)
- 13. Personal first aid kit
- 14. Rain gear
- 15. Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, etc)
- 16. Flash light
- 17. Extra set of clothing
- 18. Backpack or duffle bag and day pack
- 19. Wrist-watch
- 19. Money for our Trading Post of Lodge items (Neckerchief, patches, and various other items).

Please NO matches, food and snacks.

Leave your Merit Badge Sash and any medals at home.

If you are over 18, you must meet these additional requirements:

- 1. Youth Protection Training (YPT), be current and up to date.
- 2. Be fully compliant with California AB506, which includes mandated state training and a Live Scan background check, except if the following:

AB506 NOT REQUIRED IF (OVER 18 AND):

Scouts who are participants in BSA activities and therefore not volunteers, even if over the age of 18. **AB506 REQUIRED IF (OVER 18 AND)**:

Regular Volunteer means an individual 18 years of age or older who volunteers his or her time and has direct contact with, or supervision of, minors for more than 16 hours per month or 32 hours per year. AB-506 defines Regular Volunteer as a "volunteer . . . who is 18 years of age or older and who has direct contact with, or supervision of, children for more than 16 hours per month or 32 hours per year." If you know that you will spend more than 16 hours in any given month, or 32 hours in a year, in direct contact with, or supervising children, then you qualify as a Regular Volunteer. BSA policy requires that every individual in California who qualifies as a Regular Volunteer comply with AB-506.
